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Dear Parents and Carers of Children in Years 1 to 6,

Seesaw Class App

As we continually review how best to support children with their learning outside of school, we will be introducing the learning platform Seesaw for Years 1 – 6. Seesaw is an app and online programme that is accessible on any device and allows teachers to set home learning and share information remotely. Seesaw is completely safe and secure; only you and the year groups teachers will have access to your child's profile and the work that they post.

You have been provided with the login information for your child's account. If using a mobile device, such as a phone or a tablet, please download the **Seesaw Class App** (not the Family and Parents one). If using a computer, go to the website <https://app.seesaw.me/>. Select 'Login as a student' and then either scan the QR code or type in the 16 letter password provided.

Once you have logged in, you will be able to see a sample assignment your class teacher has posted. A paper copy has also been sent home with your child. You may complete this in one of two ways:

- Complete the assignment directly on Seesaw using the tools provided (typing, drawing, voice recording, etc.)
- Complete the paper assignment and then take a photo of your work and upload it onto Seesaw

Please complete and submit the assignment by **Friday 2nd October**. It is vital for us to ensure families have some access to Seesaw in case any self-isolation or lockdown is required. If you are unable to access Seesaw please let your child's class teacher know. We will continue to make alternative arrangements for those who have limited or no internet access or electronic devices.

If you are unable to login or have lost your access code, please email seesaw@kelvingrove.lewisham.sch.uk with your child's name and class and we will send you a replacement. We look forward to launching this new way of working and will keep it under review as we seek to explore manageable, safe and secure ways of communicating between school and home.
