All the instructions are included for you.</p> <p>Zentangle patterns are unplanned, abstract, black-and-white art made up of beautiful patterns. The Zentangle Method was invented by Rick Roberts and Maria Thomas, they found that drawing abstract patterns with a few basic rules could be a mindful form art.</p>
