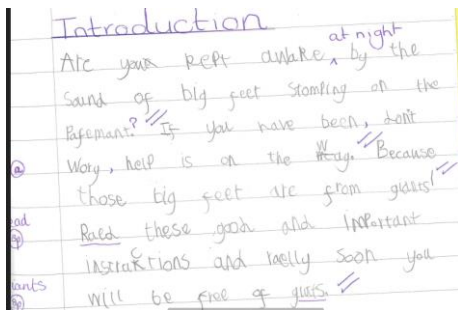

This week, the children compared teen numbers using the language greater than, less than and equal to.

e.g., $14 > 12$

$12 < 14$

$12 = 12$

They have also learnt how to add ones to teen numbers, using their knowledge of number bonds. If you know:

$5 + 2 = 7$

Then

$15 + 2 = 17$

This week, the children have observed the changes that have happened to their cress seeds and bean plant. They have found out that water is the best liquid to grow cress with.
