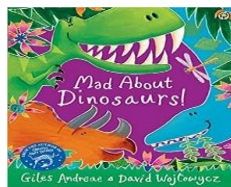

This week's learning

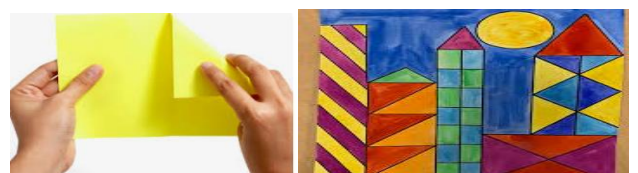
English

This week we have been reading 'Mad about Dinosaurs' by Giles Andreae and David Wojtowycz. The children have been learning many fascinating facts and key information from food and fossils to herds and horns.



Maths
