



NETHERCOTT FARM TRIP

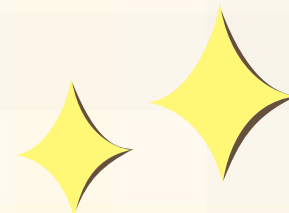

The trip is Monday - Friday, with children experiencing life on a working farm and truly immersing themselves in the experience. Hosted and organised by the charity Farms For City Children.

FARMS FOR CITY CHILDREN



Clare and Michael Morpurgo established FFCC in 1974 and the founding farm, Nethercott House in Devon, opened in 1976, held by FFCC on a long peppercorn lease. In 2001, the Charity purchased the house outright and began a programme of much-needed refurbishment.

The charity offers city children from all over the country a unique opportunity to live and work together for a week at a time on a real farm in the heart of the countryside.



THE HOUSE




While at Nethercott Farm we stay in a manor house with Nethercott Farm staff providing and preparing all meals. The house offers up spacious rooms for meal times, relaxing and games. In the evenings when the Nethercott team leave it is just Kelvin Grove staff and the children in the house.



Nethercott House sits overlooking the Dartmoor National Park in a stunning rural location. It is a grand but homely Victorian manor house with sweeping lawns that lead down to the serene River Torridge. It provides an oasis of peace and calm for our visiting farmers.

The Charity has established a long standing relationship with the Ward family which allows the children to experience life on a real farm. The children travel to Bridgetown farm via a trailer.






The children, alongside the KG Staff, will live in the house for the entire week.

The children will sleep in dorms, which all have bunkbeds.

Boys will reside at one end of the house and the girls at the other end. KG adults have their rooms in between.
